WATTS.HAPPENING PRIVACY POLICY

At Elia Transmission Belgium ("**ELIA**", "we", "our", "us"), we are convinced that, to build a trusted relationship with our Customers and Users ("data subject", "you", "your") and to provide reliable Services, it is essential for us to protect your Personal Data and to be open about the way we handle your personal data.

The Watts.Happening Privacy Policy ("**Privacy Policy**") applies to your access to and use of the Watts.Happening Platform, including all content and Services available at or through the Watts.Happening Platform.

This Privacy Policy is part of the Watts. Happening Terms and Conditions (being either those set out (here) or as otherwise agreed between you and us) and Cookie Policy, and sets out the basis on which any Personal Data we collect from you, or that you provide to us, will be processed by us.

If you elect to not provide the Personal Data we require, we may not be able to provide all our Services to you. If you do not agree to the terms of this Privacy Policy, please do not use our Services.

The terms "Customer", "Customer Data", "Watts.Happening Platform", "Personal Data", "Services", "User", are defined in the Watts.Happening Terms and Conditions.

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1. Who is responsible for the collection and use of your Personal Data?

The following entity is responsible for the collection and use of your Personal Data: Elia Transmission Belgium ('ELIA') SA/NV, a public limited company organized under the laws of Belgium with registered office Boulevard de l'Empereur 20, 1000 Brussels and registered with the Register of Legal Entities of Brussels under company number BE 0731.852.231. 2. Compliance

We use our best efforts to ensure our data processing activities are compliant with applicable data protection legislation, including Regulation (EU) 2016/679 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) ("GDPR") and the Belgian Data Protection Act of 30 July 2018, each as applicable, and as amended or replaced from time to time (the "Applicable Data Protection Laws").

3. Why do we collect and use your Personal Data?

Personal Data may only be collected and processed for specified and lawful purposes and may not be processed in a manner incompatible with those purposes. We use the Personal Data we hold about you in the following ways:

In general

- To provide you with the Services;
- To run Customer and marketing communications and events;
- To handle your queries;
- To conduct research and development (e.g. by means of data analytics) to enhance and improve the Services;
- To secure, maintain and support our networks, systems and applications;
- To offer you a customer support for the Watts. Happening Platform;

For our Users of the Watts. Happening Platform

- To ensure that the content from our Watts. Happening Platform is presented in the most effective manner for you and for your computer/device;
- To notify you about changes to Watts. Happening Platform;
- To provide you with information about other Services we offer that are similar to those that you have already used or enquired about;
- To provide you with information about Services we feel may interest you;
- To carry out our obligations arising from any contracts entered into between you and us and to provide you with the information and Services that you request from us;
- To administer our Watts. Happening Platform and for internal operations, including troubleshooting, data analysis, testing, research, statistical and survey purposes;
- To allow you to participate in interactive features of our Service, when you choose to do so;
- As part of our efforts to keep our Watts. Happening Platform safe and secure;
- To manage our Watts. Happening Terms and Conditions with you and resolve any disputes relating to our Watts. Happening Terms and Conditions;
- To respond to general queries relating to our Services or Terms and Conditions;
- To comply with applicable laws if applicable;

• If reasonably necessary in connection with a dispute in which we are or may become involved either directly with you or with a third-party;

For direct marketing

• If/when marketing communications are foreseen, if you have consented to receive these marketing communications from us via email, you can change your mind and withdraw that consent. You can opt-out by clicking on the Unsubscribe link at the bottom of the email you've received or updating your User account settings. Alternatively, you can send an email at: privacy@elia.be

To protect ELIA

- When we may be required by law enforcement authorities or courts to disclose your Personal Data;
- For the exercise or defense of legal claims, and to exercise and protect the rights of ELIA, including determining our liability;
- To enforce our Terms and Conditions, and keep records of such enforcement, including using your
 data to analyze whether you have breached the Terms and Conditions (such as by misusing the
 Watts.Happening Platform or acting fraudulently), which may result in us disabling or terminating
 your Services if we have the right to do so.

We may also process your personal data:

- For internal and external audits;
- For the management of disputes with Customers, suppliers and other data subjects.

4. Whose Personal Data will be processed?

ELIA will process the Personal Data from you as defined in the introduction of this Privacy Policy to provide you with the Services in accordance with our Terms and Conditions.

As Customer, you have the responsibility to communicate this Privacy Policy to the User, in order to inform the User of the processing of his/her Personal Data in the context of the Services and/or the Watts. Happening Platform. This could be done in a number of ways (e.g. publishing this Privacy policy in the employee handbook or manual; posting the Privacy Policy on notice boards; including the Privacy Policy as part of an employment agreement; etc.).

5. Cookies

Our Watts. Happening Platform uses cookies. This helps us to provide you with a good experience when you browse our Watts. Happening Platform and allows us to improve it. For detailed information on the cookies and the purposes for which we use them, see our Cookie Policy.

6. Which Personal Data will be collected?

We will collect and use the following Personal Data:

- Identity information (e.g. first and last name);
- Contact information (e.g. professional phone number and email address);
- Platform related information (e.g. electronic identification, communication language preference, etc.);
- Information you give us (Customer Data);

ELIA does not seek to collect personal data revealing racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs, or trade union membership, or genetic data, biometric data for the purpose of uniquely identifying a natural person, data concerning health or data concerning a natural person's sex life or sexual orientation.

The above types of information may not always contain Personal Data (i.e. data which identifies a person). Some of this information may instead contain non-personal data (i.e. data that does not identify you).

7. What are the legal bases for our use of your Personal Data?

A. Our legitimate interests

Where applicable, we process your Personal Data if this is necessary to pursue our legitimate interests in relation to the provision of the Services, provided that our interests are not outbalanced by your interests or rights and freedoms (e.g. your privacy rights). For example, we process Personal Data:

- To conduct research and development to enhance and improve the Services;
- To provide the Services and the Watts. Happening Platform (e.g. we use your Personal Data to prevent fraud, to secure our Watts. Happening Platform; etc.); and
- To disclose your Personal Data when we may be required to do so by law enforcement authorities
 or the courts.

B. Our legal obligations

We process your Personal Data if this is necessary for us to comply with our legal obligations, including to comply with decisions rendered by courts or public authorities.

C. With your consent

In some cases, we will ask for your free, prior and informed consent before processing some of your personal data (e.g. your email address for marketing purposes if you have not subscribed to our newsletter).

8. Recipients of your Personal Data

We will share your Personal Data with others for the following purposes:

- We use external service providers in connection with the development, marketing and provision of the Services. These service providers may in certain circumstances obtain access to your Personal Data when providing services to us;
- Where we are required by public authorities (e.g. law enforcement or regulatory authorities) and courts to disclose your Personal Data to them;
- If reasonably necessary in connection with a dispute in which we are or may become involved, we may share your Personal Data with, for example, the other part(y)(ies) involved in the dispute or with a court of law;

We may also share your information with:

- our affiliated companies e.g. any company of the Elia group
- our professional advisers;
- our providers of analysis and search engines which help us improve and optimise our Watts.Happening Platform;
- Fraud detection agencies and other third parties who operate and maintain fraud detection registers;
- Third party service providers related to the operation and maintenance of the information systems
 processing your Personal Data (these providers only have access to the personal data necessary
 to carry out their missions)

We will also disclose information to third parties under the following circumstances:

• In the event of the purchase or sale of a business or assets, we reserve the right to disclose your Personal Data to the vendor or purchaser of the business or assets. During such transactions, if ELIA or all of its assets were to be purchased by a third party, the information concerning its Customers/Users would be part of the assets transferred;

Where we are required to disclose or share your information to comply with a legal obligation or to
protect the rights, property, or security of ELIA, of our Customers or of others. This includes the
sharing of information with public authorities in the event of, for example, a cyber incident.

9. How long will we keep your Personal Data?

We keep your Personal Data for no longer than is necessary for the purposes for which they are processed. We use the following criteria to set the periods during which we will keep your other Personal Data:

- Our legal obligations to retain certain of your Personal Data;
- Periods during which a claim can be initiated by or against us;
- Necessity for us to conduct audits (e.g. security audits);
- Necessity to use your Personal Data in the framework of any current or potential disputes;
- Any guidelines issued by relevant data protection authorities.

After termination or expiry of your subscription to the Services, we will either delete your Personal Data relating to your use of the Services or keep such Personal Data in a form that cannot be traced directly back to you.

10. Will your Personal Data be transferred to other countries?

We may transfer your Personal Data to a destination outside the European Economic Area ("**EEA**"), if that is appropriate (i) to achieve any of the purposes set out under section 3 and/or (ii) to disclose your personal to third party service providers, which may include supplier of IT or storage services such as service providers or software-as-a-service providers (some of which may be located outside EEA zone).

If your Personal Data is being transferred to countries located outside of the EEA, we will ensure that appropriate safeguards are taken, such as:

- The transfer falls within the scope of an adequacy decision taken by the European Commission under Article 45 of the GDPR;
- Standard data protection contractual clauses, as approved by the European Commission or a data protection authority pursuant to Article 46.2(c) or (d) of the GDPR, have been established; or

11. Is your Personal Data secured?

ELIA will implement appropriate technical and organizational security measures to protect your Personal Data against accidental or unlawful destruction or accidental loss, alteration, unauthorized disclosure or access, and against all other unlawful forms of processing.

12. What are your rights in relation to your Personal Data?

Depending on and subject to Applicable Data Protection Law, you have certain rights regarding the Personal Data that we hold about you in the context of the Services. Please note that you may exercise the abovementioned rights only in relation to the Personal Data we hold about you in the context of the Services.

These rights include the following:

The right to be informed: You have the right to be provided with clear, transparent and easily
understandable information about how we use your Personal Data and your rights related thereto.
This is in part why we are providing you with the information in this Privacy Policy;

- The right of access: You have the right to obtain access to your Personal Data. You may wish to
 access your Personal Data to confirm our use in accordance with Applicable Data Protection Law;
- The **right to rectification**: You are entitled to have your Personal Data rectified if they are inaccurate or incomplete;
- The **right to erasure**: This is also known as 'the right to be forgotten' and, in simple terms, enables you to request the deletion or removal of your Personal Data where there is no compelling reason for us to keep using it. Please note that this is not an absolute right and exceptions apply;
- The **right to restrict processing**: You have rights to block or prevent further use of your Personal Data. When processing is restricted, we can still store your Personal Data, but our use of your Personal Data will be restricted;
- The **right to data portability**: You have the right to obtain and reuse your Personal Data for your own purposes across different services. For example, if your relationship with us ends, this right enables you to move, copy or transfer your Personal Data easily between our IT systems and those of another service provider, without affecting its usability. Please note that this is not an absolute right and exceptions apply. Also, this right can be applied only in certain circumstances and provided it does not adversely affect others' rights (for example, it can be applied with regard to the Personal Data you provided to us, which we processed in order to fulfil our contract with you);
- The right to object to processing: Where the processing is based on our legitimate interest, you
 have the right to object to such processing unless we have a compelling and legitimate reason to
 continue processing your Personal Data;
- The **right to object** at any time to the processing of your Personal Data for direct marketing purposes by unsubscribing from our mailing list or by sending an email to our correspondent at privacy@elia.be;
- The **right to lodge a complaint**: You have the right to lodge a complaint about the way we handle or process your Personal Data with the Belgian data protection authority. - The **right not to be subject to automated-decision making**: You have the right not to be subject to a decision that is based solely on automated processing (including profiling) and that produces legal effects for you or similarly significantly affects you.

13. How can you exercise your privacy rights and contact ELIA?

For more information about our use of your Personal Data and to exercise your privacy rights, please contact us as follows:

- you can exercise your right of access, right to data portability, right to erasure and right to object, by clicking on the relevant links on the Platform;
- you can directly rectify your account-related Personal Data through your account; and

We will try to comply with your requests as soon as reasonably practicable and always in accordance with the legally prescribed timeframes. Please note that, if we have doubts about your identity, we may require you to provide us a proof of your identity to, for example, prevent unauthorized access to your Personal Data.

Please note that, if you have requested the erasure of your Personal Data, we may still have to retain certain Personal Data if so required or authorized by law.

14. Changes to this Privacy Policy

We may update this Privacy Policy from time to time, in particular to reflect any (potential) legislative or regulatory changes. All changes we make to our Privacy Policy will be posted on our webpage and, if applicable, we will notify you of any changes to the extent required by law.
